## **Community Need and Our Innovative Approach**

Poverty, unemployment, and hunger are critical issues in Philadelphia. The city is the poorest of America's 10 biggest cities, and has the highest deep-poverty rate. Poverty causes significant suffering, including homelessness and food insecurity. Currently, there are roughly 6,200 homeless Philadelphians, including 900 people on the street. More than 1 in 4 Philadelphians are food insecure. The same issues exist in Southern New Jersey, Delaware and other surrounding areas.
